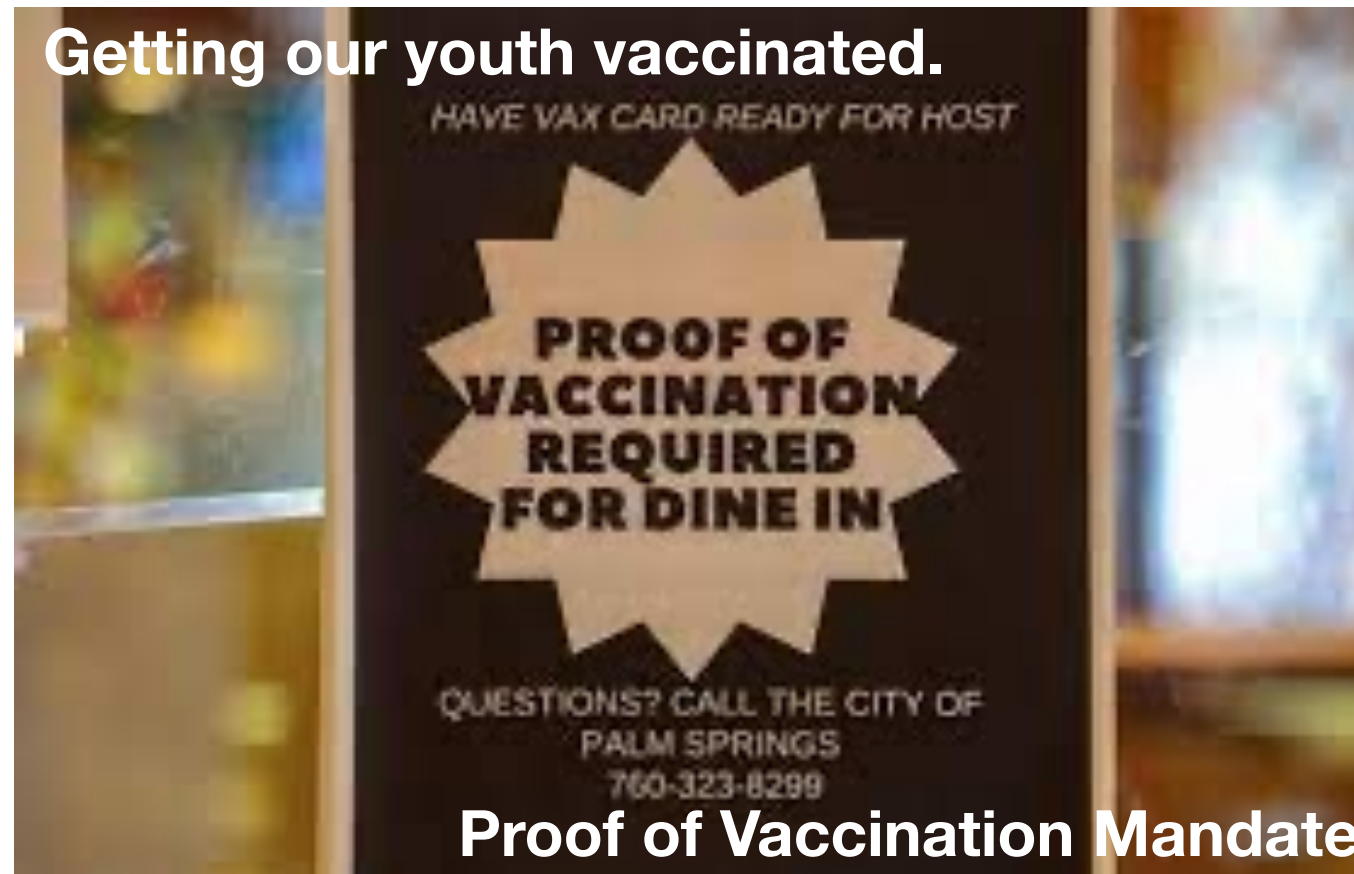

More **US cities** requiring proof of vaccination to go places

New York City's policy applies to restaurants, bars and other such entertainment venues

San Francisco requires patrons at indoor restaurants, bars, gyms and entertainment venues to show they are fully vaccinated.

Los Angeles is considering a vaccine requirement at indoor businesses. They voted to direct city attorneys to work out the details.

Majority of U.S. employers will implement vaccine mandates

According to a **Willis Towers Watson** poll conducted last month, 52% of the 961 companies surveyed said they'll have at least one vaccine mandate in place by the fourth quarter of 2021, a significant shift since May, when 72% of respondents said they didn't plan to require vaccines. (September 7, 2021) Advisory

73% of Americans want to work for a company that protects its employees during a pandemic.

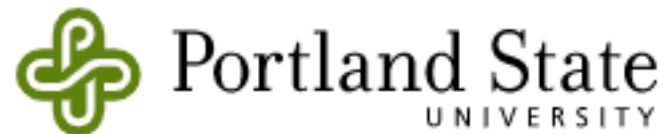

YES!

Portland State University requires all employees and all students who live, work, learn, or access services on our campus to be **vaccinated** against COVID-19 starting fall term 2021.



YES!

and proof-of-vaccine requirements at designated events, including athletics events, concerts and conferences.



NO!

Portland Community College has announced that **it will not require students or employees to be vaccinated as a condition of employment or enrollment this fall term**. This decision was recommended unanimously by the college's COVID-19 Opening Leadership Team and approved by the College President Mark Mitsui. [source](#)

Booster Priorities

Governor Brown and Oregon Health Authority

Director Banks explained how the Western States Scientific Safety Review Workgroup expanded on [the federal recommendations](#) to support use of the Pfizer booster among people ages 18-64 who have underlying medical conditions, and who are in occupational or institutional settings that put them at higher risk of COVID-19 exposure and transmission.

These include:

- Health care workers, first responders such as firefighters and police, and congregate care staff.
- Those who work in educational settings such as teachers, support staff and daycare workers.
- Food and agriculture workers.
- Manufacturing workers.
- Corrections workers.
- U.S. Postal Service workers.
- Public transit workers.
- Grocery store workers.

In Oregon, “health care workers” includes all patient-facing health care staff, not just medical workers. This includes food service and housekeeping staff at hospitals; workers who treat high-risk patients in outpatient substance use treatment programs, those who provide non-emergency medical transportation, work in hospices, or care for those with intellectual and developmental disabilities — All the same groups that were prioritized to receive the COVID-19 vaccines in [Phases 1a and 1b of Oregon’s vaccine distribution plan](#).
