Vaccinations

- Vaccination remains the most effective tool to reduce the spread of COVID-19.
- The Pfizer, Moderna and Johnson & Johnson COVID-19 vaccines are highly effective at preventing severe COVID-19 illness and death.




Figure 1. COVID-19 cases per 100,000 per week, by vaccination status

- Cases of COVID-19 are much more common in unvaccinated individuals than in vaccinated individuals (Figure 1).


Delta is currently the dominant variant circulating in Oregon.






People vaccinated per 10,000: lighter colors represent counties with lower vaccination rates, while darker colors represent counties with higher vaccination rates.





Los Angeles is considering a vaccine requirement at indoor businesses. They voted to direct city attorneys to work out the details.





Majority of U.S. employers will implement vaccine mandates

According to a **Willis Towers Watson** poll conducted last month, 52% of the 961 companies surveyed said they'll have at least one vaccine mandate in place by the fourth quarter of 2021, a significant shift since May, when 72% of respondents said they didn't plan to require vaccines. (September 7, 2021) Advisory

Breakthroughs Oregon

- Relatively few breakthrough cases have been hospitalized, and even fewer have died. To date, 4.5% of all known breakthrough cases have been hospitalized (n=1036), and only 0.9% have died (n=204).
- The median age of the people who died is 81 (range: 36-101).

During the week of September 12-September 18,

11,994 cases of COVID-19 with 9,216 (76.8%) being unvaccinated and 2,778 (23.2%) were vaccine breakthrough cases.

700 (25.2%) cases were 65 or older.


There were 68 (2.4%) cases aged 12-17.

'Religious' Exemptions Add Legal Thorns to Looming Vaccine Mandates

Booster Priorities

Governor Brown and Oregon Health Authority

Director Banks explained how the Western States Scientific Safety Review Workgroup expanded on the federal recommendations to support use of the Pfizer booster among people ages 18-64 who have underlying medical conditions, and who are in occupational or institutional settings that put them at higher risk of COVID-19 exposure and transmission.

In Oregon, "health care workers" includes all patient-facing health care staff, not just medical workers. This includes food service and housekeeping staff at hospitals: workers who treat high-risk patients in outpatient substance use treatment programs, those who provide nonemergency medical transportation, work in hospices, or care for those with intellectual and developmental disabilities—All the same groups that were prioritized to receive the COVID-19 vaccines in Phases 1a and 1b of Oregon's vaccine distribution plan.

These include:

- Health care workers, first responders such as firefighters and police, and congregate care staff.
- Those who work in educational settings such as teachers, support staff and daycare workers.
- Food and agriculture workers.
- Manufacturing workers.
- Corrections workers.
- U.S. Postal Service workers.
- Public transit workers.
- Grocery store workers.

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
