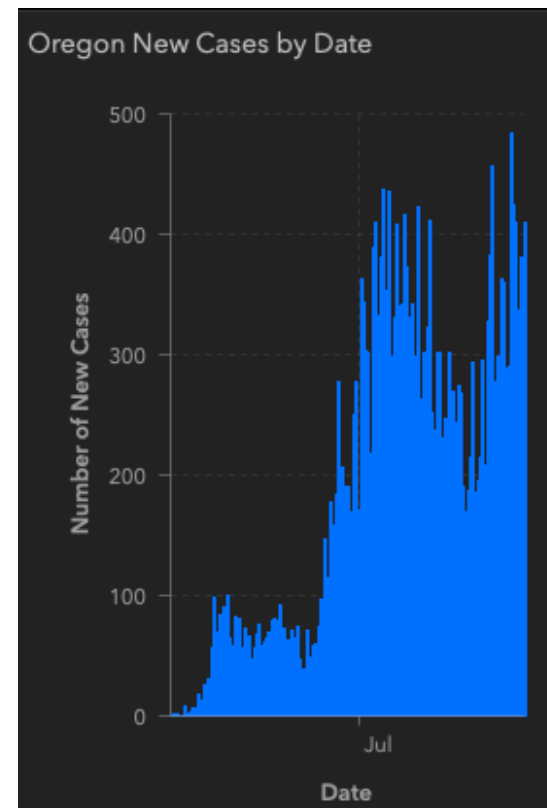

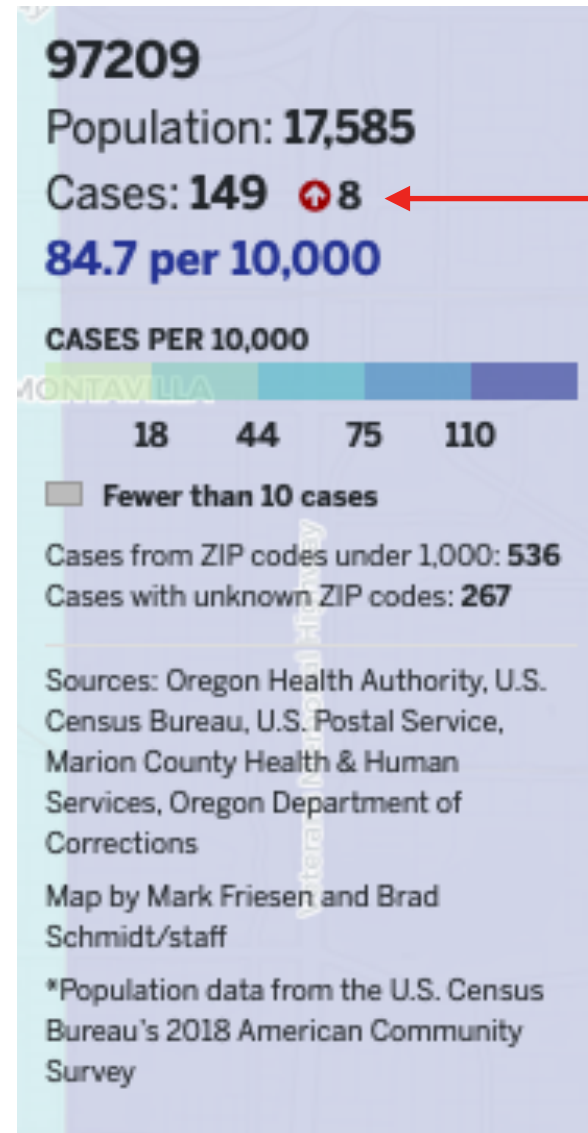

# Survey Results

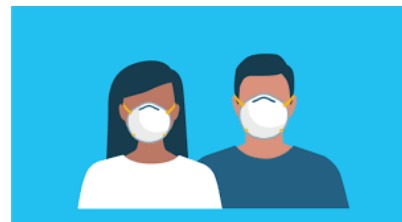
**Social gatherings with a few people are more common than gatherings with 10 or more people.**

66% got together with a few family or friends outside.

52% got together with a few family or friends inside someone's house.

20% attended a social gathering with 10 or more people.

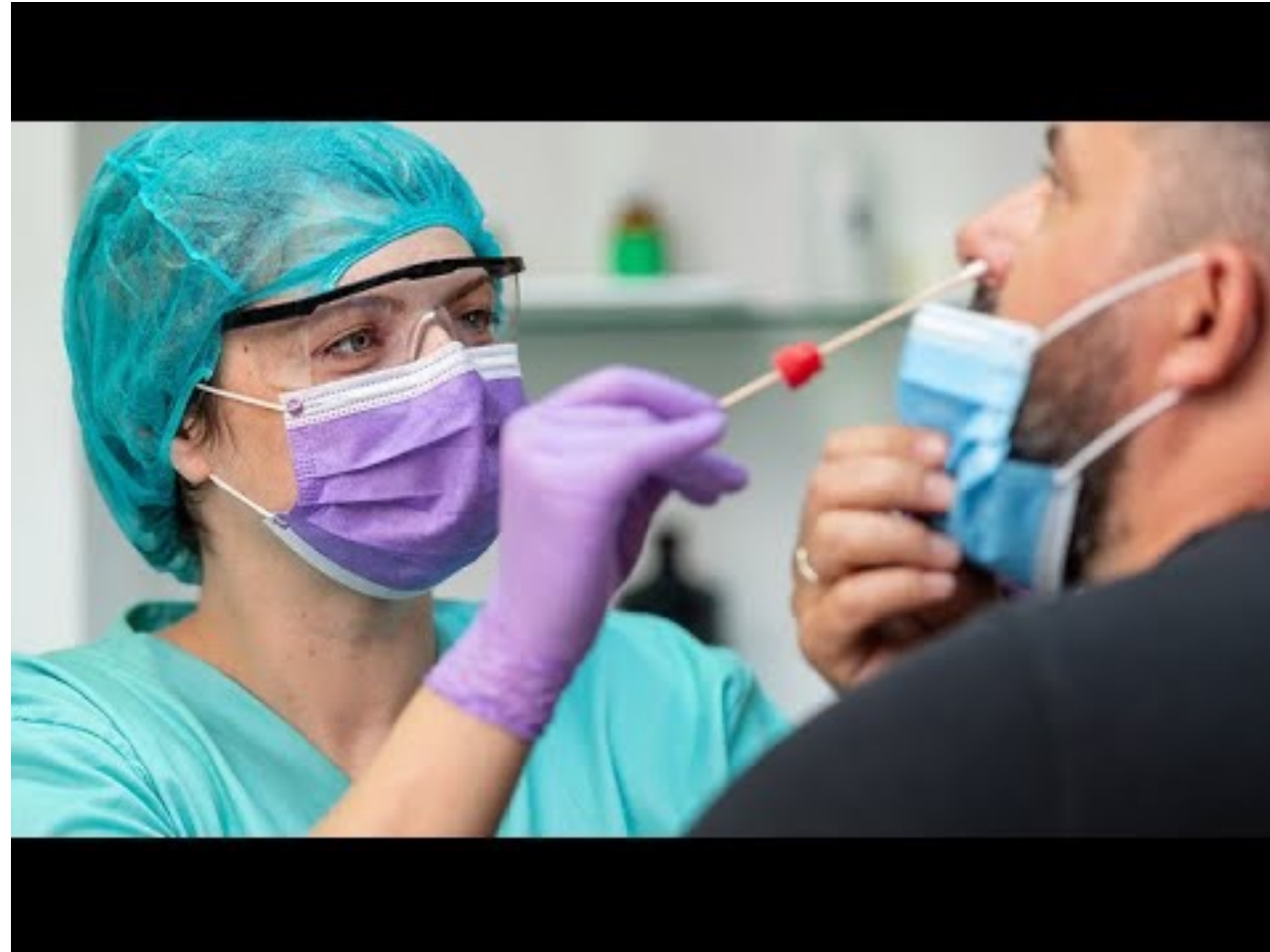
**On average, Oregonians take personal protective measures most of the time.**



84% wear a mask indoors in public nearly all the time.

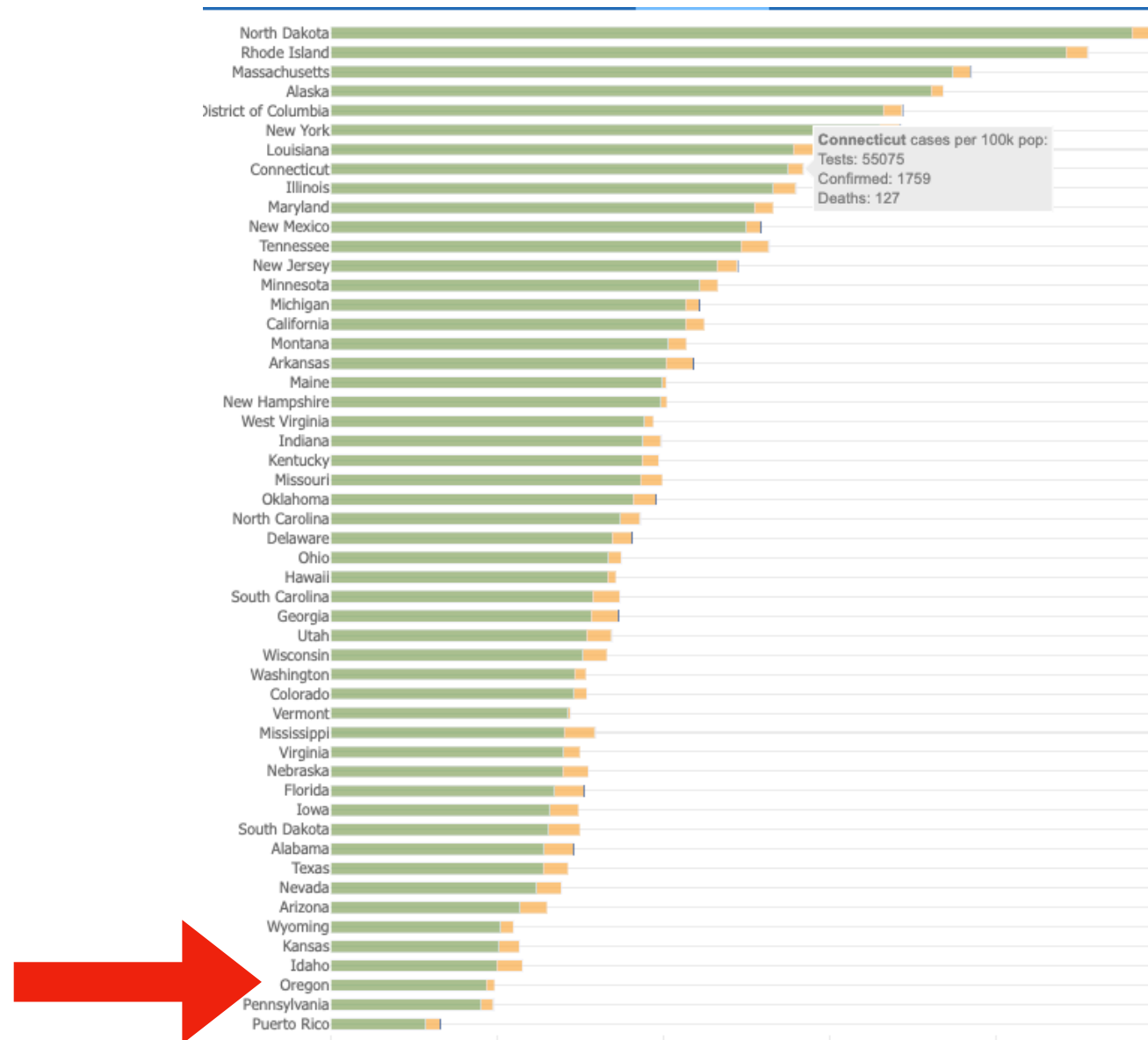
75% frequently wash hands nearly all the time.

# Expanded Testing Capacity

Oct. 6, 2020 - Starting this week

Oregon is receiving between 60,000 to 80,000 Abbott BinaxNOW rapid point-of-care antigen tests\* per week through end of year, doubling Oregon's testing capacity.

OHA also now recommends testing for anyone who has symptoms of COVID-19

regardless of severity, and all close contacts of those individuals, even if they have no symptoms.

\*Rapid antigen tests have strengths and weaknesses.
