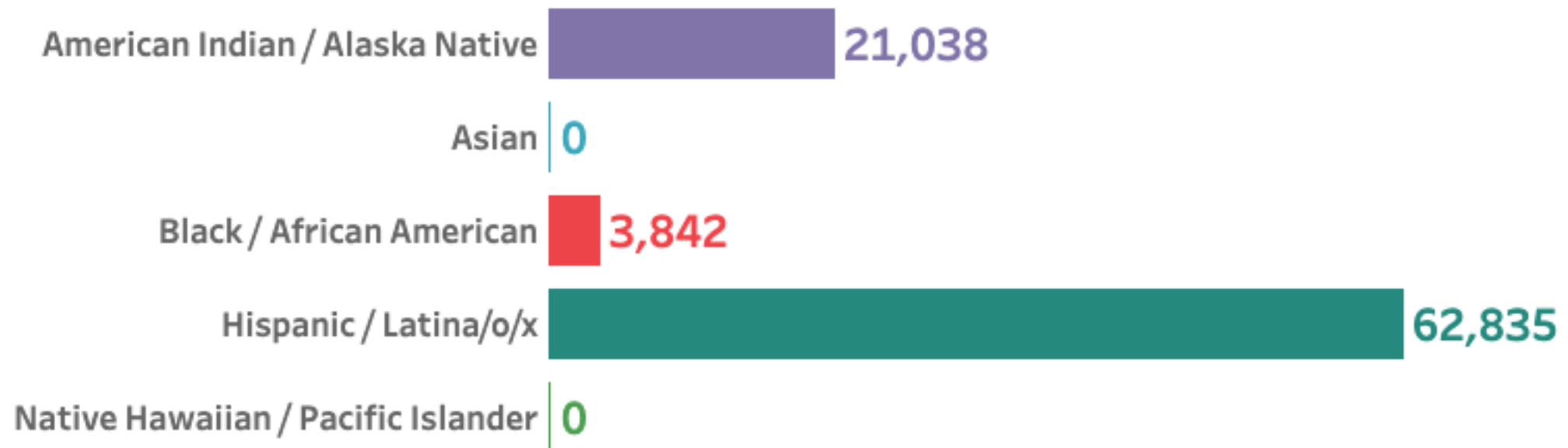

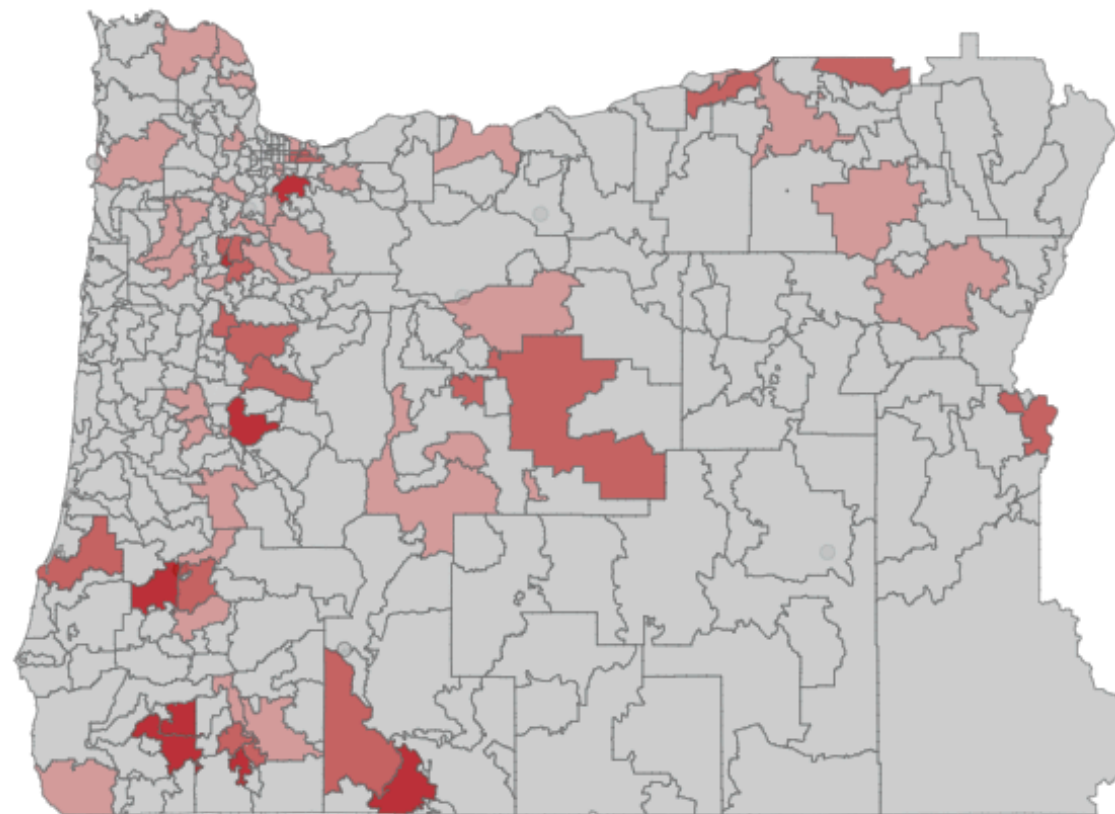

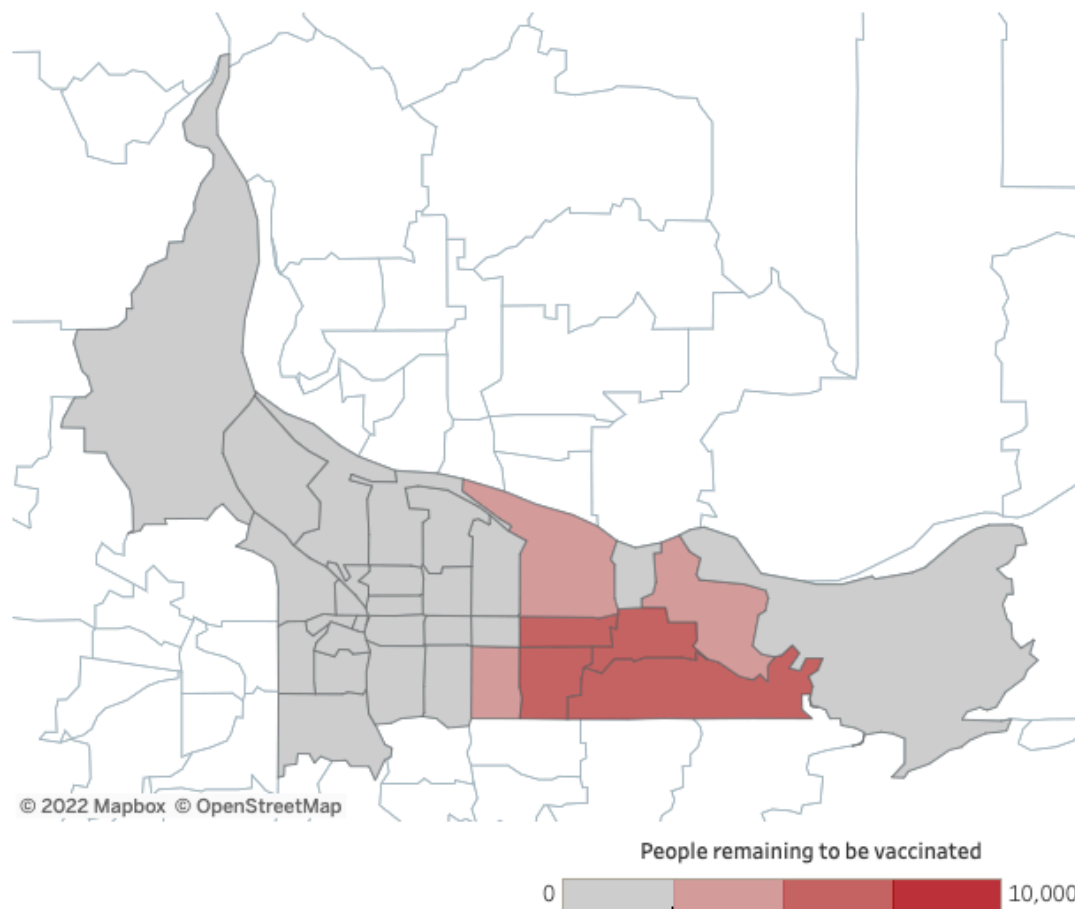

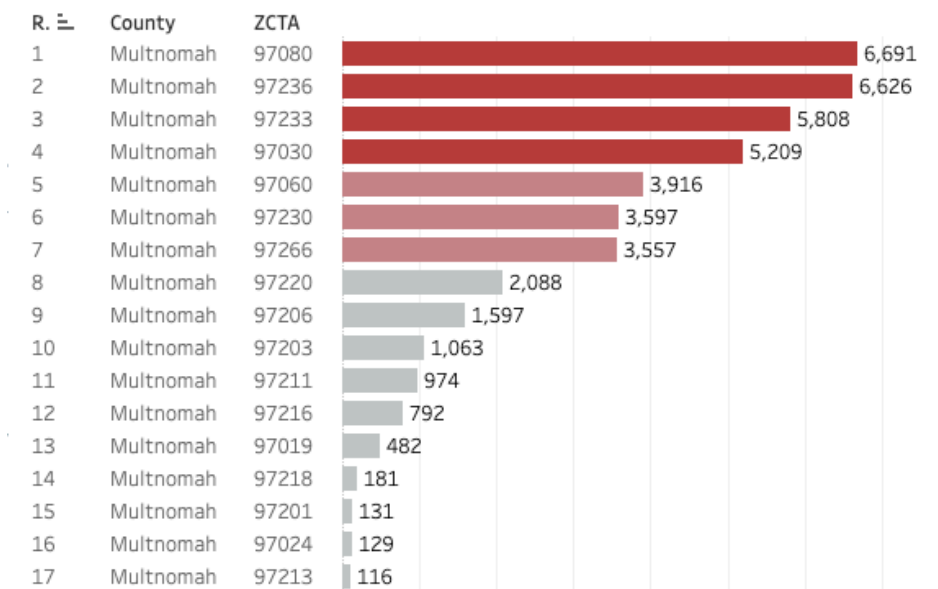

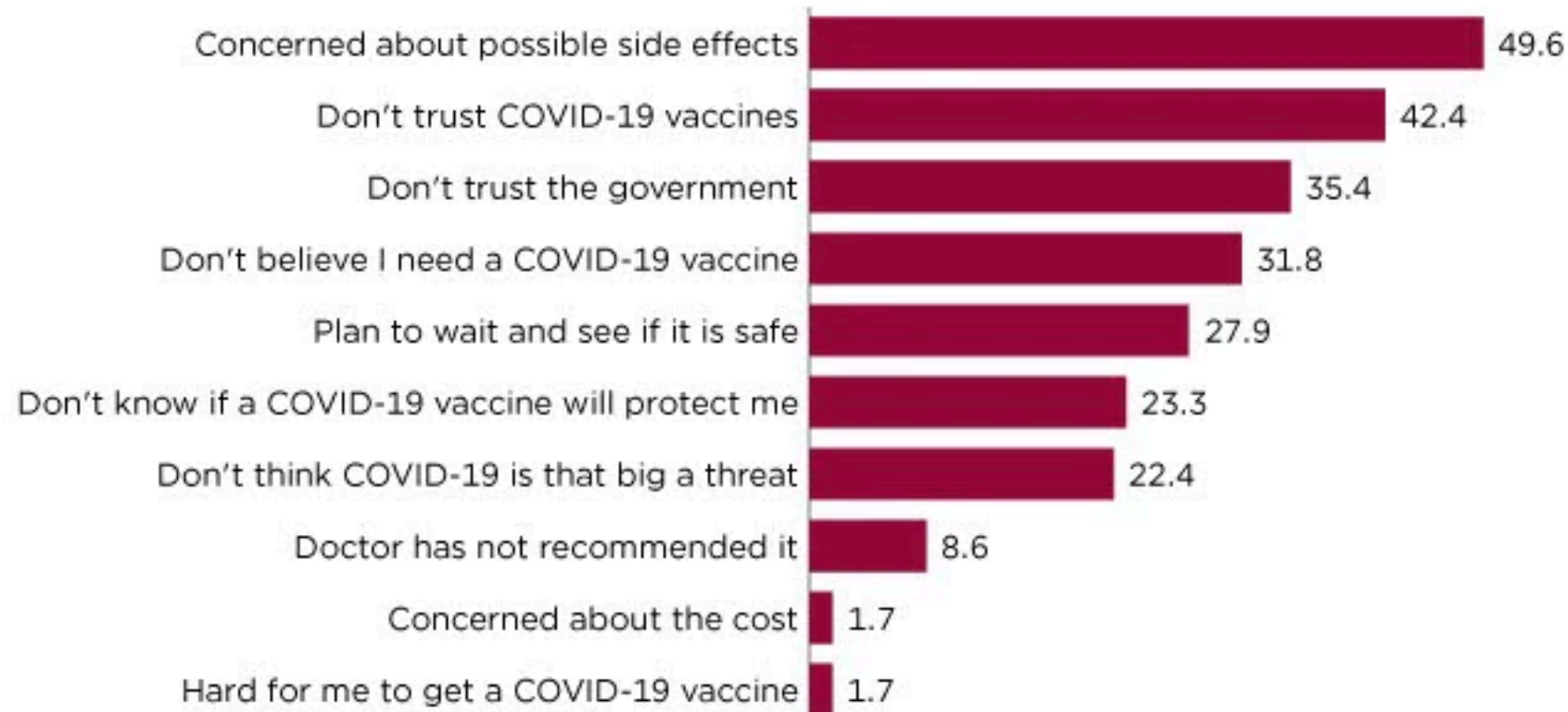

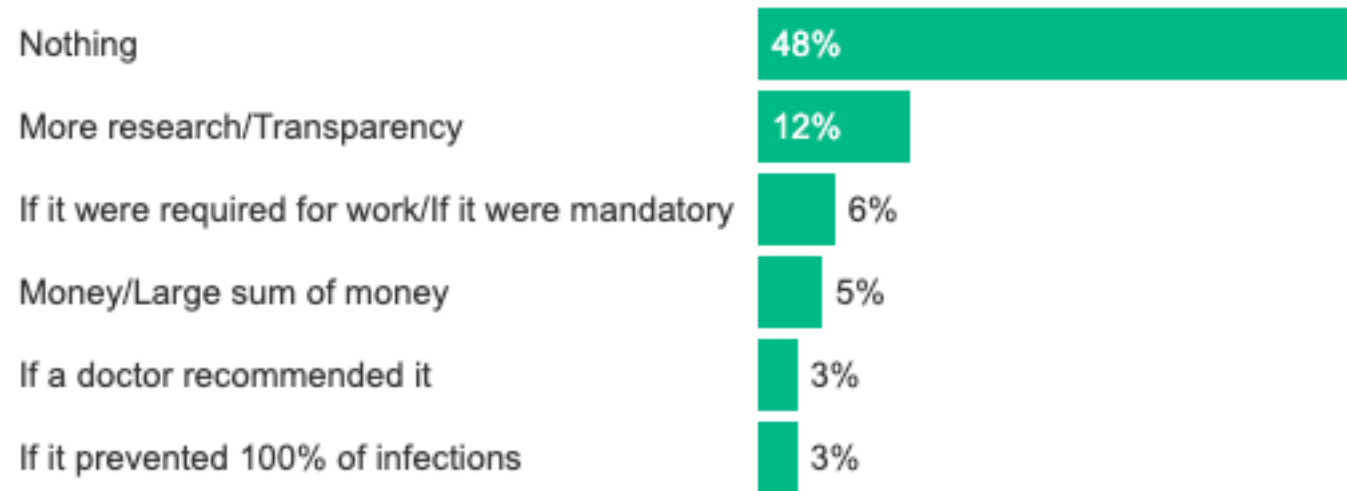

## **Hospitalizations** **Oregon**

The number of hospitalized patients with COVID-19 across Oregon is 510, which is 12 more than yesterday. There are 111 COVID-19 patients in intensive care unit (ICU) beds, which is seven more than yesterday.

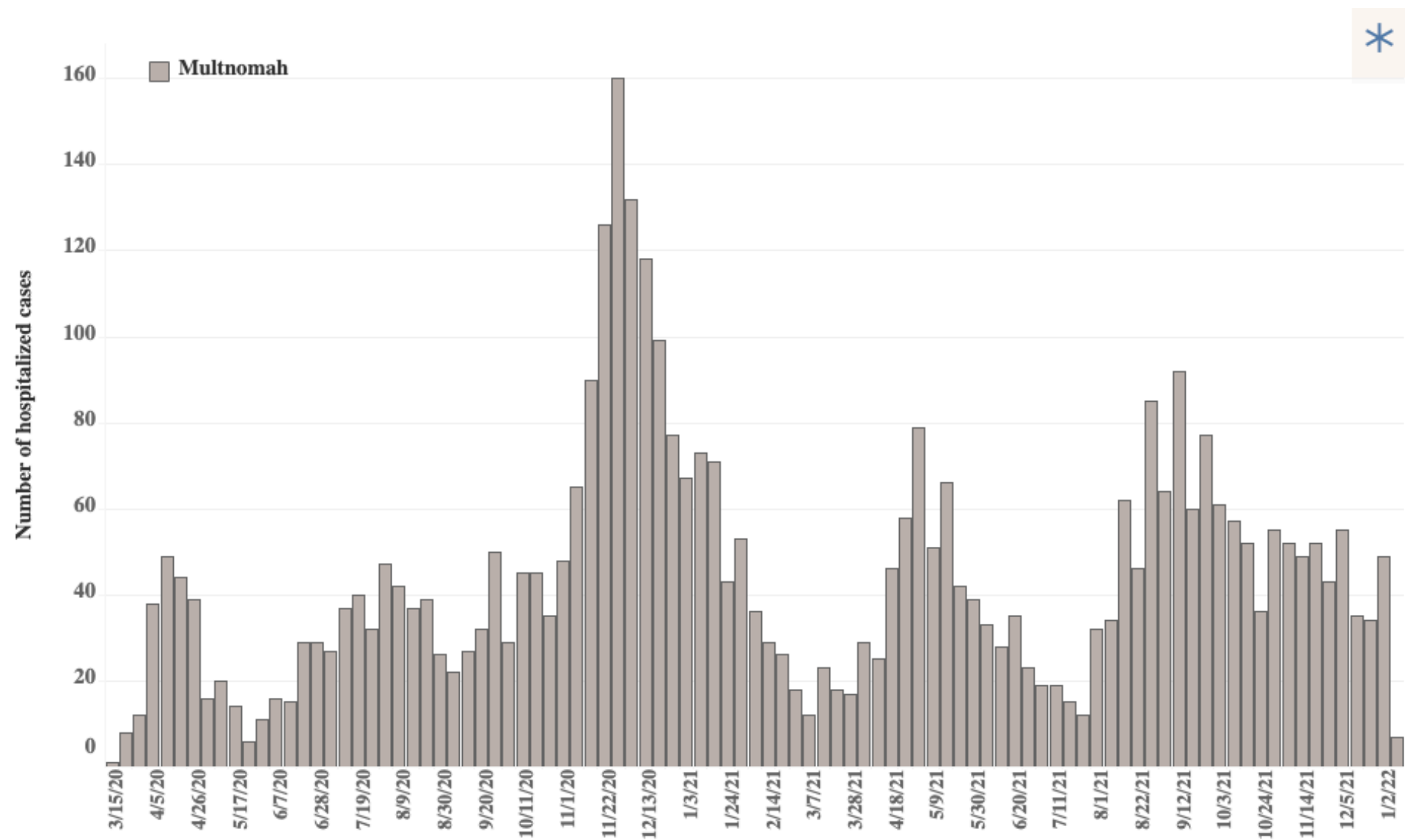
### **AVAILABILITY**

## Breakthrough Cases

## Oregon

Overall, there have been 53,604 vaccine breakthrough cases identified in Oregon.

The median age of breakthrough cases is 46 years (range: 9-106).

1,722 (3.2%) breakthrough cases were residents of care facilities, senior living communities or other congregate living settings. 12,071 (22.5%) cases were 65 or older.

There have been a total of 1,616 (3%) cases aged 12-17.

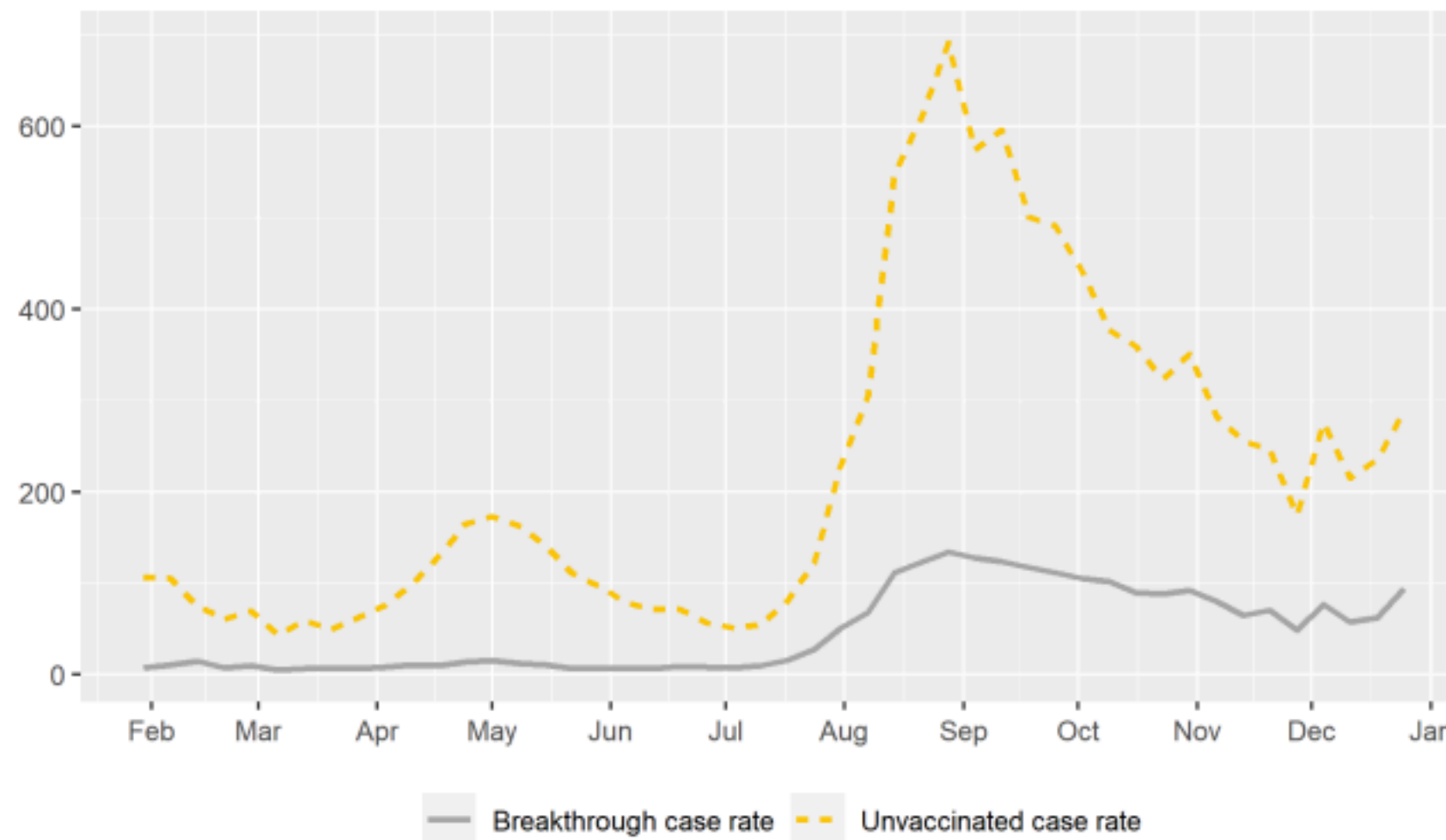
Breakthrough cases have been reported in all 36 counties.

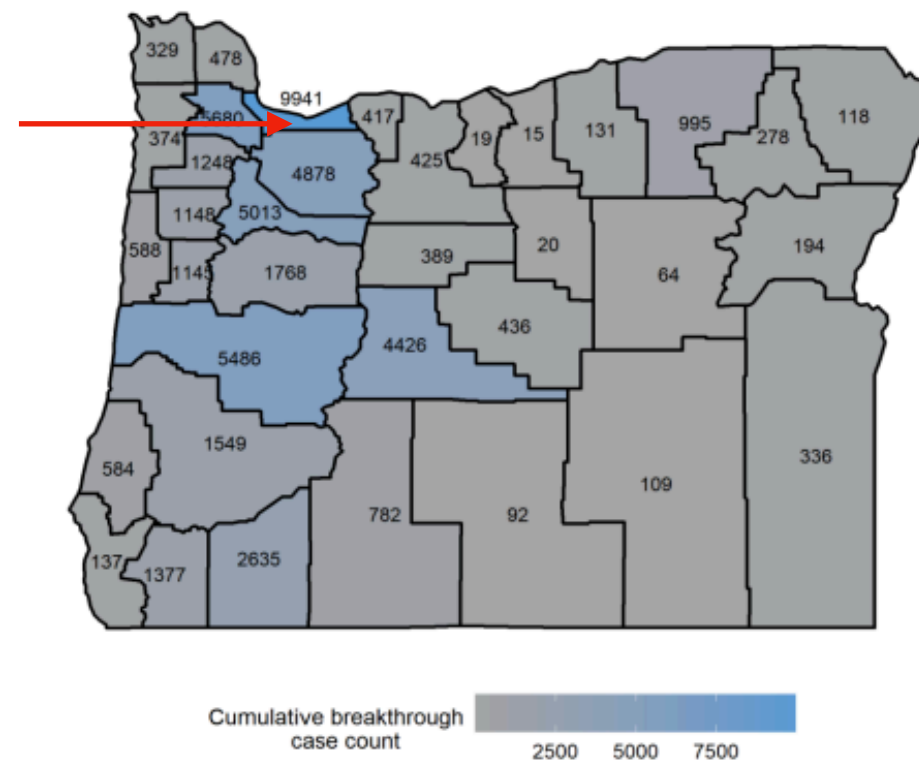

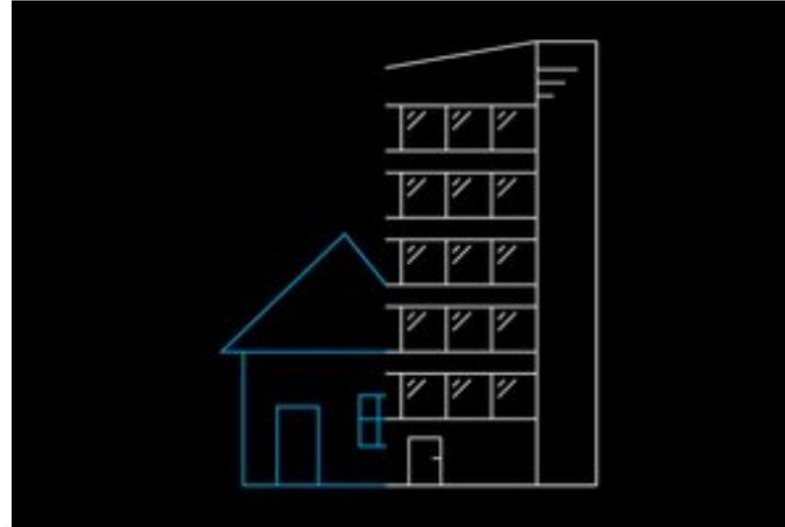
